



Students Under 13: Accessing Pre-AP Classroom

Why do you need a College Board account?

If you're taking a Pre-AP course, you'll need access to [Pre-AP Classroom](#)—the online platform used to access instructional resources and assessments. A College Board account is required to access Pre-AP Classroom.

Once you create a College Board account, you'll be able to use that same account for any College Board course or assessment such as the SAT Suite of Assessments or future AP courses.

Obtaining a College Board Account: Students Under 13

Students under 13 must have parent/guardian consent before they can create an account. Here's what needs to happen:

Step 1: Parents: complete the [Account Creation Consent Form \(PDF\)](#).

Step 2: Submit the form by **either**:

- Scanning and emailing the [Account Creation Consent Form \(PDF\)](#) as an attachment to the **school's point of contact** who will send all forms in a single batch.
or
- Completing the [Account Creation Consent Form](#) digitally and emailing it as an attachment directly to **accountrequest@collegeboard.org**.

The school will inform parents which submission method to use.

Step 3: Students update the password within seven days of receiving their account link. The link will be emailed to the address provided on the form.

Timeline: Account Creation

Parent completes the Account Creation Consent Form.

Form is submitted using one of the two submission methods.

Within seven days of **College Board** receiving the completed form, a password reset link will be sent to the student's email address provided in the form, cc'ing the parent's email address.

The student updates the temporary password on the account **within seven days** (or the link will expire).

Access granted! Students can explore Pre-AP Classroom and other College Board offerings.
